Our government must uphold the right of everyone to earn equitable rewards for contributions to our economy, which will help reverse the alarming trend of growing economic inequality. Maine needs jobs with livable wages for all who can work, with a minimum wage high enough to raise workers out of poverty. Implements a fair, progressive tax system that pays for needed public services and focuses tax responsibilities on those most able to pay.</li><li>6. Is committed to placing a cap on property tax liability based on a family's income.</li><li>7. Works to reform the fiscal balance to more effectively address income inequality by making taxes more progressive and reducing budgetary reliance on regressive funding mechanisms such as the sales tax.</li><li>8. Ensures that all government pensions are exempt from the state income tax in the same manner as Social Security income.</li><li>9. Makes inheritance or estate taxes more progressive, fair, and appropriate.</li><li>10. Offers tax incentive programs that are carefully considered, limited in time, and only offered in exchange for clear commitments to job creation, with repayment penalties for failure to meet commitments.</li><li>11.
